Township Updates

Municipal Complex

Township Election Results

On Tuesday, November 6, residents elected a new Mayor, Angie Devanney, and two new Township Council members, Alvaro Medeiros and Stephen Yellin. All three will be sworn in on Tuesday, January 1, 2019. Details to follow.

Warren Proposed Development

On Monday, October 29 and Saturday, November 3, the Township held resident stakeholder meetings to listen to and collect the concerns of our residents about the proposed redevelopment projects in Warren Township.

Fall Leaf and Yard Debris Collection

The annual fall Leaf and Yard Debris Collection program began the second week of October and will continue throughout the Township until December 19th.

Initially, leaves and debris ("brush") will be picked up at the same time.

Brush:

All brush must be bundled with twine and out for pick up on the first day of the scheduled week for the section. Each of the Township's five sections will have a brush pick-up starting on the first day of the scheduled week for that area, weather permitting. All brush should be curbside on the first day scheduled in each section. There will be only one brush pick-up per household.

Leaf Collection:

Leaf collection run concurrently with brush collection and then will continue across all sections for the duration of the Fall cleanup program. Volume can be intermittent - one week you may have no leaves and the next you may have significant volume. Leaves should be put into paper bags and left curbside, accessible by machine. Please do not include any other types of debris in the leaf bags.

All leaves must be bagged and placed curbside by Wednesday, December 5, as all collection is scheduled to end on December 19.

Environmental Commission Update

Applications are now being accepted for garden plots at the Berkeley Heights Learning Community Garden located at the Littel-Lord Farmstead, 31 Horseshoe Road, Berkeley Heights. Both the Berkeley Heights Township Council and the NJ DEP's Green Acres program have approved the site.

If you would like to apply for a community garden plot, complete <u>the application</u> on our recently updated website. If more than 30 applications are received, plots will be assigned via a lottery system. All gardeners must sign and accept the operating rules of the BHLCG, which are included in the application available on our website

The goal is to begin preparation of the area for the garden—including removing turf, installing the fence, and building the beds—as soon as possible in order to utilize grant money that is available to us. Gardeners can start planting in spring of 2019. Please be on the lookout for opportunities to volunteer. These opportunities, along with updates on the other environmental projects going on in Town will be posted on the Environmental Commission website and Facebook page.

Board of Health

The Berkeley Heights Board of Health along with the New Jersey Department of Health emphasize the importance of hand washing for everyday prevention of flu. Start with Hello BH is a local group of volunteers working to bring Sandy Hook Promise's proven and innovative programs to the community to help address violence, social isolation and bullying.

After the Parkland tragedy in February, 2018, several Berkeley Heights residents with a shared vision organized Start with Hello BH to move community conversations about kids safety and inclusion forward under the tenants of Sandy Hook Promise and began making themselves available in the community.

To date, two successful presentations have been held at district schools by teaching kindness and inclusion to 2nd-5th grade students, and by focusing on being an upstander and how and who to talk too when you have concerns at the middle school. The assemblies were each complemented with school-based activities. We are also looking into the benefits of SSARS as an improvement on current procedures.

Our overall goal is to continue rolling out the assemblies to the rest of the district schools in 2019 and establish a long term plan to ensure all students in the district receive the training over the years.
